#### **School News and Events:**

#### **Horotiu School Gala & Initial Meeting for Volunteers:**

It's that time of year again when we need to start planning for our major fundraising event of the year, our Annual School Gala. The date for this is set down for Sunday 2nd April, 9am-1pm (please note this in your diary and underline it  $\bigcirc$ ). Later in the term we will be calling on all Horotiu School families to join our school staff to help make the day a success. And as the saying goes, more hands make light work.



To get us started right now though, we would appreciate anyone keen to be involved with the planning group to please attend our initial Gala Planning Meeting in the staffroom on Wednesday 15th February at 2.45pm. We will discuss how the Gala works, what we need help with and note down any new ideas/suggestions.

Royal New Zealand Air Force Band Concert: Please send along a gold coin donation Last year we were able to secure a fantastic opportunity for our whole school to attend an educational, high-energy concert by Te Tauaarangi - the NZRAF Band. This will take place on Thursday 23rd February at 11am. Students will be travelling as a school group by bus with teachers. The cost per student is a gold coin donation. Please forward this donation to classroom teachers for collection. Students need to wear their school tshirt and suitable footwear. We will have morning tea before leaving and enjoy lunch on our return.

The band will share their love of music and introduce tamariki to a wide range of musical styles. The concert will included everything from classical music through to pop and movie tunes, and include the famed resident drum line and RNZAF Band vocalists.

#### Year 3/4 'Get Set Go!' Tabloids:

This is the first Inter-school event of the year for our sporting and cultural cluster. Usually this is a Year 1/2 event but has been changed to a Year 3/4 event being held and hosted by our school. More information will come about this from the Harakeke teachers as the day approaches but we do suggest booking it into your calendars, particularly if your child(ren) is in Year 3/4 and you want to come along and support.

#### **Outdoor Experience Week: Week 6**

Classes across the school are set to take part in our 'Outdoor Experience Week' from Monday 6th - Friday 10th March. As a school we want our students to be able to explore and experience learning beyond the classroom walls and the school gate in what is known at EOTC - Education Outside the Classroom. As part of our EOTC Continuum we have four areas that we want our students to experience over the course of their time at Horotiu School. These are:

- 1. **Water Safety** (Awa). Physical Education programme use the school pool to develop stroke and Water Safety awareness.
- 2. **Environment/Wellbeing** Flora & Fauna and Food & Nutrition
- 3. Walking/Tramping Hikoi
- 4. Biking/Riding

Our 7 & 8 hub, Maanuka, is heading off to camp in Term 4, however all hubs from Tiitoki (Reception) to Kawakawa (Year 5/6) will run an outdoor experience programme in Week 6, Term 1.

#### **Hubs are Humming!**

Our students have quickly settled into their hubs, making the most of their learning time and getting back to our school routines. Thanks to those whaanau who attend the 'Meet the Teacher' sessions on Tuesday evening - it's so great to have the opportunity to catch up with you kanohi-kanohi, face to face. Information shared by each hub have been forwarded out to all families so that those who were unable to attend still know what's happening for their child(ren) in the relevant hub.

#### **Swimming Sessions:**

Term One always has a large focus on water activities, including daily swimming sessions for each of the hubs - we are very grateful to have our own school pool, making this possible. It is therefore critical that all students bring their togs every day in preparation for this. Please be aware that our swimming sessions are not about students swimming endless lengths as some may expect. They are about developing confidence in the water, growing an awareness of water safety, enjoying physical education activities and games within the water, as well as having a whole lot of fun! Students already have been using life jackets in the pool and floating, collecting ping pong balls as quickly as they can in team challenges, and building rafts out of buoyant equipment. If your child is not swimming, they really are missing out, and it is part of the school curriculum. Please support teachers in ensuring your child brings their togs each day.

We use it to send individual messages (ie to whaanau about their child's day and/or successes), class notices to hubs of students and whole school notices when needed. Please know that Class Dojo is free - there is no need to purchase any 'extra benefits' that Dojo may offer.

#### 2023 Bus

Bus tickets will remain the same price for Term 1, 2023. Due to the rising costs everywhere, the School Board are looking at sustainable options for the future. As you will be aware the Ministry of Education are concerned about the number of out-of-zone students attending our school, considering that Horotiu has a large number of housing developments within zone.

#### School T-Shirts, Fleeces, Jackets

How wonderful our school looked at our first powhiri of the year all dressed in our school tshirts. We encourage your child(ren) to wear our school tshirt whenever we have a special occasion, school event or whenever they are representing our school. It brings us together as one, helps to make our students identifiable and brings a sense of shared belonging. Details are below if you still need to order items.

#### **Horotiu School Uniform Items**

Although we don't wear an official full uniform that students wear on a daily basis, we do still have compulsory clothing **every** student must have. These are to be worn for school events such as Pōwhiri, school trips and special events.

Students are expected to purchase these as soon as possible if they do not have them already. We have a powhiri in Week one of Term 1 and a whole-school trip in February where all students will be expected to be wearing these. #### Compulsory:

- Every child must have the School Polo Shirt (\$45)
- Every child must have either the School Fleece (\$25) and/or the School Jacket (\$65)
- Every child must have a wide-brimmed hat or a cap **with** a flap on the back for Terms 1 and 4. The School Hat is available for \$18.50 should you wish for your child to wear this one.

#### Striving Together for Success in All That We Do:

#### **Community Conduct Expectations**

Horotiu School is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for students, staff, and visitors.

Our Code of Conduct serves as a reminder to all parents, caregivers, and school visitors that their conduct must support everyone's emotional and physical wellbeing, and not harm it in any way.

#### The Code of Conduct applies:

- to all conduct, speech, and action, and includes emails, texts, phone calls, social media, or other communication
- while on school grounds or at another venue where students and/or staff are assembled for school purposes (such as a camp or sports match).

#### Standards of conduct

Horotiu School expects parents, caregivers, and visitors to:

- treat everyone with respect
- work together in partnership with staff for the benefit of students
- respect and adhere to our school values
- set a good example for students at all times
- follow school procedures to handle any complaints
- adhere to school policies and procedures (such as those listed below), and any legal requirements.

#### Examples of unsuitable conduct include:

- threats, bullying, harassment
- profanity/offensive language
- insulting, abusing, or intimidating behaviour
- racism or discrimination (e.g. based on ethnicity, religion)
- physical aggression
- deception/fraud
- damaging school property
- smoking, vaping, possessing, or using alcohol/drugs/other harmful substances on school premises or at another venue where students and/or staff are assembled for school purposes (except possession or use of alcohol in accordance with school policy)
- placing unreasonable and excessive expectations on staff time or resources
- pursuing a complaint or campaign, or making defamatory, offensive, or derogatory comments, regarding the school, its board, or any staff or students on social media or other public forums
- wearing gang insignia on the school grounds. (This is not allowed under the Prohibition of Gang Insignia legislation, and anyone wearing it will be asked to leave.)

#### **Dealing with breaches of the Code of Conduct**

How Horotiu School deals with breaches of our Code of Conduct depends on the nature of the incident and its seriousness, and the process any witness or victim of the behaviour feels most comfortable with.
