Horotiu School Gala:

We have been doing something a little different in Kawakawa in Week 8. We have been learning about having a budget and using Google sheets to help us to automatically calculate our expenses so we don't have to add things up one by one.

So far we have had to design a weekly meal plan for family of four, purchase a house as well as all of the accessories that are needed in a house, as well as have a budget of \$200 for a whole year to purchase all the clothes that we need from scratch. We have learned that it is not easy as it sounds and that if you buy a pair of crocs for \$90, that there isn't much left for important things like underwear!

The students have worked so well collaboratively and we hope that there are some fascinating conversations going on at home too, about how much things actually cost! If your child logs into their google account from home, they will be able to show you the work that they have produced so far.
