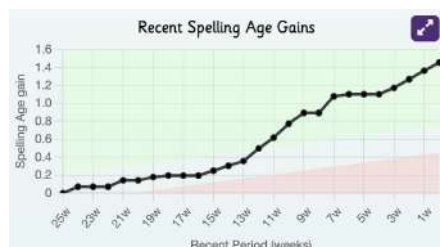
Educational Games and Activities - Turn learning into fun by playing board games, creating obstacle courses and making puzzles - great ways to practise communication, and problem-solving skills.

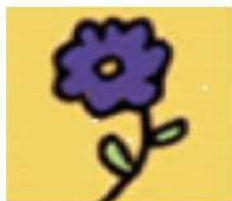
